Medical School: Loma Linda University School of Medicine


Clinical Interest: I am interested in point of care ultrasound, and its ability to improve patient care while remaining affordable.

Name: Brianna Peacock, MD (Dermatology)


Medical School: Texas A&M University School of Engineering Medicine
