John C. Lincoln Medical Center is a 239-bed, not-for-profit community hospital located in Phoenix, AZ. John C. Lincoln Medical Center is an ACS Level I Trauma Center, Chest Pain Center, accredited Stroke Center, and provides 24/7 emergency services. John C. Lincoln Medical Center also provides services in critical care, pulmonary hypertension, ECMO, oncology, and bariatric surgery. John C. Lincoln Medical Center is a teaching hospital with a Surgery Residency program and is Magnet-designated.

The Department of Pharmacy provides 24/7 services, supported by approximately 50 pharmacy personnel. The hospital has a computerized electronic health record, an automated dispensing system, and decentralized clinical pharmacists.
